# United make sure of another Derby

**Cambridge United 5, Dagenham 2.**

Three goals in the first 10 minutes of this East Anglian Cup 1964-65 semi-final against Dagenham at the Abbey Stadium last night meant that Cambridge United were booked for yet another local 'Derby' with Cambridge City, who had already reached the final, writes **David Hallett**.

The success story of last night's game was of the youngsters drafted into the United side in order to give some first teamers a rest.

Graham Felton, playing on the right wing, found he had the beating of his full-back and time and again, especially in the first half, he swept past his opponent to set up goal chances.

### Polished

His inside forward partner, Brian Whitmore, snaped up two of the first three goals and generally gave a polished performance.

At full-back David Burton turned in his usual sound performance and it seems likely that he will be the first of the present crop of local youngsters to make the grade in the Southern League side.

At the other end of the scale Gerry Baker, making his debut for the club after signing from King's Lynn, had a quiet game but he showed that he will be a valuable acquisition when he settles into his new surroundings.

Dagenham, the Athenian League amateurs, gave a spirited performance and they played some of their best football after the first 10 minutes when they closed the gap to 3-2. The task, however, was too much for them and towards the interval United took over again to add their fourth goal.

John Turley opened the scoring after two and a half minutes when he cut in from the left wing, exchanged passes with David Barrett and crashed the ball into the net.

### Quick goals

In the eighth minute Felton centred for Whitmore to net from the near post. Two minutes later the same player made it three with a long range effort that kicked off a defender on its way into the net.

In the 15th and 34th minutes Harris scored twice to narrow the gap but right on half-time Felton was fouled on his wing and his accurate free kick was headed home by John Turley.

The only goal of the second half came in the 74th minute when Bettinson could only punch a fierce shot from Bennett straight to Barrett and the inside-forward headed over the goalkeeper into the net.
