Schoolboys in exciting 3-3 draw

Cambridge City schoolboys started their build-up for their English School trophy first round match against Oxford with a 3-3 draw against the South Cambridgeshire boys at Chesterton School yesterday.

It was a fast, exciting game, both teams having their moments of superiority.

The county had won both the two previous encounters and had they been able to field a full strength side, it seems likely they would have completed a hat-trick. City, at full strength, started well and Newman and Murray quickly gave them a two-goal lead.

Before the interval Waters reduced the deficit and in the second half two quick goals by Jarman and Thornhill put South Cambridgeshire in the lead for the first time.

Robert Bell rallied the City side and, as the county defence faltered, Austin had a powerful shot deflected by a defender for the equaliser.

The game was such a success that another has been arranged between the two sides for Thursday morning on the same ground.

In the first half hour it seemed certain that United's attack would produce several goals but the
